ATTENDANCE

Students will be recognized quarterly for perfect attendance. Attendance is a requirement for promotion. If your child has to be absent, please send a valid written excuse to the office within two days of the absence. It is very important for your child to **be on time each day** and **stay until school is dismissed**. Tardies and early outs should only be necessary for medical reasons/emergencies. Early outs after 1:45 pm are discouraged, so that we can ensure a safe/orderly dismissal for everyone. If it is necessary to change your child's regular mode of transportation you must notify the school in writing. This is for safety purposes.

BUSES, BUS DISCIPLINE AND BUS RULES

Safety on the buses are necessary to ensure each child's well-being. The order maintained on the bus is a huge responsibility for the driver; therefore, the driver is required to report any disorderly bus conduct to the school administration. Very clear expectations allow the students to know the consequences for failing to follow school bus rules. The bus rules and consequences are as follows:

BUS RULES

Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.

Sit in assigned seat and remain seated.

Avoid profane or obscene language, gestures, or loud noises as they are not permitted.

Avoid damaging seats, windows, or bus equipment as this is not permitted.

Avoid tobacco products or other illegal materials as this is not allowed on the bus.

Follow the driver's directions.

CONSEQUENCES OF BROKEN BUS RULES

1st Referral	The student will be warned by an administrator and the parent will be contacted.
2nd Referral	The parent will be contacted and the student may be suspended from the bus up to 3 days.
3rd Referral	The parent will be notified and the student may be suspended from the bus up to 5 days.
4th Referral	The parent will be notified and the student may be suspended from the bus up to 1 month.
5th Referral	The parent will be notified and the student may be suspended from the bus for the year.

* Consequences can be more severe based on the severity of the child's actions.

We ask that you be timely in picking up your child. Children become very upset when they are left without a ride. Emergency contacts will be called for students remaining at school.

CLINIC

Our school nurse is on duty daily (Monday – Friday)

Accidents The school makes every effort to provide a safe environment for all of the children. In the event of an accident, the school nurse or a member of the staff will render first aid and notify parents as necessary. Parents must keep emergency cards updated in case the school needs to reach them.

Medications All medications must be registered with the school office. A Charleston County School District medication form must be completed by the physician and parent and be on file in the school clinic. Medication will be administered by our nurse. It must be in the original container labeled with the child's name and dosage. At the end of the year, parents must return to the school to collect any unused medication.

Safety – Student's safety is number one. We must ensure all of our students are in a safe environment.

Property – Everyone takes care of their things as well as things that belong to others.

Respect – Students will first respect themselves and as they get to know and trust others, respect them as well.

Time on task – Students need to be focused and ready to learn every day.

EMERGENCY CARDS

Parents/Guardians must complete an emergency card for their children at the beginning of the school year. The school office must have a current address and telephone number at all times in case of an emergency. Please notify the school as soon as possible when moving, changing telephone numbers or place of employment, etc. This is to ensure the safety for every child by providing a means of communication if needed. In the event of an emergency dismissal, students who normally walk to school, ride a bike, or ride in a car will be held until a parent arrives. Please note that we are not permitted to relay identifying information regarding students via telephone.

FIELD TRIPS

Each grade level will go on multiple field trips throughout the year. These trips will be standards based and will help the students understand their lessons. Please assist us by making sure all documents have been completed and returned to your child's teacher.

GRADES

K-2 grades are reported using the State Rating Scale of C = Consistently Demonstrates; E = Emerging; N = Not Met; NA = Not Assessed. The grading scale for 3rd – 5th is: A = 100- 90; B = 89 – 80; C = 79 – 70; D = 69 – 60; F = 59 – 0. A report card will be issued to each student after each nine week period. Interim reports are issued midway through the grading period. If your child is having difficulty, please monitor your child's work and keep in close contact with the teacher. Parent conferences are generally scheduled for after school as not to disrupt the teaching and learning process.

GUIDANCE

Guidance in the elementary school is concerned with the mental, emotional, social, physical and educational developmental needs of the students. Students will participate in classroom guidance on a monthly basis along with individual and group counseling as needed. Small groups will meet periodically throughout the year to target specific concerns such as anger control, study skills, etc. Parents/guardians will be notified about small group participation so they can decide if their child should participate. The guidance counselor is available to meet with parents to discuss any educational or social/emotional concerns in regards to their children.

HOMEWORK

Homework assignments are meaningful and reinforce skills studied during the day. Primary teachers will assign about 30 minutes of homework and elementary teachers will assign about 45 minutes of homework Monday through Thursday. It is helpful if the student has a set time and place to study. Please encourage your child to read daily. **The most important thing a student can do to improve academically is to read.**

MEAL PROGRAM

Lunch and breakfast will be served free for all students at North Charleston Elementary.

MENTORING PROGRAM

A mentor is a wise and trusted friend. Responsible mentoring is a structured one-to-one relationship or partnership that focuses on the needs of one student. A mentor ideally should visit his/her mentee once a week for 20-30 minutes during their lunch time and/or recess time. If you would like to become a mentor, please call the school office at 843-745-7107. Being a mentor can be a rewarding experience and will definitely be worthwhile for our children.

PARENT PROGRAMS AND COMMUNICATIONS

North Charleston will have parenting programs offered during the 2017-2018 school year. Programs may include literacy tips, health and wellness, homework tips and other interesting topics. If you have suggestions for programs, please call the parent advocate at 843-745-7107.

Graded papers will be sent home in a special folder each week. Please look over your child's papers and talk with your child about them. Interim Reports will be sent home every 4 ½ weeks and Report cards will be sent home every 9 weeks. Teachers will send home newsletters to keep you informed about the activities and topics your children are studying. Teachers and/or parents may request conferences as needed. Communication is very important to make sure everyone is working on the same goals. Please forward suggestions and feedback about our school program to the administration or guidance counselor.

PARTIES/CELEBRATIONS

Treats for birthday celebrations may be brought in during lunch time. Please let the classroom teacher know if you are going to do this. There will be treats for different holidays that may be shared during the last 30 minutes of the day. Your child's teacher will send home additional information for you when those dates are approaching.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

If a student is having academic or emotional problems, the teacher or parent/guardian may request individual testing by the school psychologist. If the results indicate the need for specific accommodations, the parent/guardian will be invited to a meeting with the psychologist, teacher, and administrator to discuss an appropriate educational plan for the student. The available programs are: Learning Disabled, Emotionally Disabled, Autistic, and Developmentally Delayed. In addition to these programs, students may qualify for special assistance in Speech or Occupational Therapy. 504 Plans are available for students with any diagnosed condition that interferes with learning, such as attention deficit disorder, or asthma. Please contact our counselor for more information.

TESTING PROGRAM

Each year the State Department of Education and the Charleston County School District administer specific tests. The Pre-K classes will take the SC Readiness Assessment and the myIGDIs Readiness Assessment. Students in Kindergarten will be administered the DRA2 and students in K-1 will be assessed with AIMS Web and Fountas and Pinnell throughout the year and parents will be informed of their children's progress during individual conferences. Students in grades 4 and 5 will take SC PASS for Social Studies and Science and students in grades 3-5 will take SC READY. We are expecting students in 1st-5th grades to test on the computerized Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) which will be administered three times during the school year. Parents/Guardians will be kept informed of their child's progress. Please feel free to schedule a conference with your child's teacher or an administrator to discuss the results of your child's test scores. A parent/guardian, the teacher and student will develop an appropriate plan to support students not performing on grade level.

TARDY POLICY

School starts at 7:25 am and students are expected to be on time. In order to support academic success, North Charleston has implemented a Tardy Policy. It is outlined as follows:

Tardy 1-4 times: Phone call/letter sent home from attendance clerk

Tardy 5-10 times: Meeting scheduled with Guidance Counselor or Parent Advocate

Tardy 10-15 times: Meeting scheduled with School Administrator

Tardy over 15 times: Meeting scheduled with Associate Superintendent and referral Truancy Office

If your child's tardies continue, you will be contacted to come in for an attendance meeting. If you do not reside in North Charleston's attendance zone, you will be required to register your child at the neighborhood school which would be his/her home school.

TITLE ONE SCHOOL

North Charleston Elementary meets the criteria to be a Title 1 School. We receive federal funding that is used for teacher salaries to reduce class size, purchase materials, and provide other resources that the Title 1 Team determines to be a need. An annual Parent Meeting is convened during the first scheduled PTO meeting and parents/guardians are invited to attend. There is also a Title 1 Plan housed in the media center and everyone is invited to stop by and read it in its entirety.

TRANSFERS AND WITHDRAWALS

The following procedures should be followed if withdrawing or transferring a student:

1. The student will return all library books and any other school property
2. The student will pay for any debts such as a lost textbook, pictures, etc.

VISITS AND CONFERENCES

All visitors must report to the office to receive a visitor's pass before going to the classrooms. All CCSD schools utilize a visitor management system that screens guests against a national sex offender registry. If a parent/guardian is on campus to observe or help in a classroom, a visitor's pass is still necessary. **Younger children should not accompany the parent/guardian on these visits, as little ones can be distractible.** Please schedule a conference with your child's teacher so that a convenient time can be arranged for both parties. Dropping in at the beginning of the day is not a good time for the teacher because all of the students are getting ready for the day and they all need their teacher's attention. Please call the school office or send a note by your child so that a time that is good for both the parent and the teacher can be determined. The teacher can give you his/her undivided attention during a scheduled conference.

VISITOR'S POLICY

Parents and other adults must enter the building through the front office to be scanned through our visitor management system and receive a visitor's badge. This is to ensure safety of the students and staff. Thank you for helping us with this very important and necessary safety policy. Please turn off cell phones when you enter the building.
